Drumming Program

This year marks the 5th anniversary of Dovercourt Club's Drumming Program. Under the Character Development Program, Drumming is an additional program that introduces and immerses members in Soundscape and Making Instruments.

Members begin the 6-week program with an introduction to an instrument, its origins and culture. The historical background allows members to brainstorm rhythm ideas and themes for performances. This program builds members' skills and knowledge for a performance at the end of the program. Fall sessions conclude with a performance at Dovercourt Clubhouse and Junction Triangle Clubhouse's Christmas Concert. Winter sessions conclude with Black History Month concert.

Soundscape brings members to the forefront. This includes performance, skits and presentations which are integral components of the Drumming Program. These performance opportunities



build confidence, focus, and discipline for members in a fun, inclusive environment. With the opportunity to perform, members directly apply the knowledge they have acquired.

Some of the Drumming Program's latest work includes rainsticks and making costumes for Black History Month concert. Each instrument, outfit and performance is customized to members' preferences. Brainstorming sessions during the beginning of the program let members create rhythms they may want to use during their performance. The Drumming program hosts 4-5 sessions per year at the beginning of each season.



Meet Rick Monaco

The Royal Conservatory of Music's program, Living Through the Arts introduced Rick Monaco to a teaching opportunity at Dovercourt Clubhouse. With over 40+ years of experience in drum making, music and performance, Monaco has facilitated the Drumming Program for the past five years at Dovercourt Club. "It's rewarding when things all come together," said Monaco. Building confidence among members is one of the key experiences for members according to Monaco and "working together in big programs, knowing their input is respected, appreciated and used when doing different shows." In addition to teaching the Drumming Program, Monaco conducts drum making workshops, recordings and performances.

Through access to a diverse set of programs and encouraging environment, Dovercourt Club builds champions like Braithwaite. And this is why it's the Club that beats the streets.

Developing Champions since 57': Paul Braithwaite

Former Canadian Table Tennis professional and now Senior Policy Advisor for the Ontario Government, Paul Braithwaite began his table tennis career at Dovercourt Clubhouse in 1958. Before embarking on a sports career which led him to join Table Tennis Canada and compete in multiple Canadian Open Table Tennis Tournaments, 9 year old Braithwaite stumbled upon the sport in Dovercourt Club's games room.

"There were so many activities," said Braithwaite. Dovercourt Club opened it's doors in 1957 and posted flyers around the community to invite members. Braithwaite joined quickly and participated in various activities – from swimming lessons, reading in the library, playing table tennis and competing in Club sports days. Braithwaite "Sportsmanship qualities that the Club encourages, I carry with me. The whole idea of being responsible, working hard, trying to achieve a goal," said Braithwaite.

Guess What's Cooking: Kids Food Nation

Boys and Girls Club of Canada and PC Children's Charity are helping kids and families develop culinary skills through a fun and interactive program. Members at Dovercourt Clubhouse, Junction Triangle Clubhouses and St. Mary Catholic School are participating in a 8-week, hands on culinary program from April - May

Kids Food Nation program was designed to help improve kids and families' health and food choices. Participants from 7 to 12 years of age have the opportunity to participate in weekly sessions where they plan and cook various recipes and meals, attend trips and participate in discussions about food and nutrition. Each week, kids are introduced to a new module that covers a specific skill set and culinary topic. The program facilitates development in skill set, knowledge and confidence. By cooking a variety of meals and learning about their ingredients and nutritional value, kids will develop the confidence to change their food habits and adopt new ones. Program coordinators have the option of choosing 1 out of 5 meal options each week. As sessions progress, the complexity, variety and quantity of food increases. So what are the young

chefs cooking? From quick salads, to chicken fingers, pizza, fruits kabobs and yogurt parfait. Each cooking session follows a knowledge-based discussion with topics ranging from kitchen safety and hygiene, chef skills and food safety to balanced meals. Members can directly apply knowledge acquired in these discussions in their later meal preparation activities. "The program teaches them life skills and allows them to try new things that they may not try in school," said Shevin Joseph, Outreach Lead. "Food tastes better when you cook it yourself!" Kids Food Nation was developed by Boys and Girls Clubs of Canada in partnership with Corus Entertainment. This program is funded by the Public Health Agency of Canada, President's Choice Children's Charities and Social Research and Demonstration Corporation.

Easter Gift Baskets



Dovercourt Club provided Easter Gift Baskets for recipients on Wednesday April 17, 2019. Over the span of a week, Dovercourt staff collected food and other items and organized them for distribution. 

Watermain Cleaning and Relining: Westmoreland and Shanly Street from Dufferin Street to Westmoreland Ave.

The City of Toronto will be cleaning and structurally re-lining the watermain in the Dovercourt community and will also replace the Cityowned portion of any substandard water pipes. Specifically, this project is conducted

on Westmoreland Avenue and Shanly Street from Dufferin Street to Westmoreland Ave.



The project will run from April 2019 to November 2019 and is a component of the Council-approved Capital Works Program to renew the city's aging infrastructure, improve water distribution and reduce the risk of watermain breaks. Due to the structural changes, community members can expect dust, noise and other inconveniences. The construction will occur from 7:00am to 7:00pm, Monday to Friday with work after hours and on weekends as required.

In addition, the Club advises parents and visitors to park cautiously around Dovercourt Clubhouse. Irregular parking is reducing visibility at intersections.
